thereon; and the Charges thereby allowable for raising the said Duties shall be satisfied, or Money sufficient shall be reserved in the Exchequer to satisfy and discharge the same; and also all the Monies coming into the Exchequer, either by Loans or Exchequer Bills, upon One other Act of this Session of Parliament (intituled, An Act for granting an Aid to His Majesty by a Land Tax to be raised in *Great Britain* for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and fifty six; and for the Relief of the Inhabitants of the City and County of the City of *Lincoln*, in respect of Arrears of the Land Tax;) and so much Money (if any such be) of the Tax thereby granted, as shall arise or remain after all the Loans or Exchequer Bills made or to be made on the same Act, and all the Interest, Premium, Rate and Charges thereon, and the Charges thereby allowable for raising the said Land Tax, shall be satisfied, or Money sufficient shall be reserved in the Exchequer to satisfy and discharge the same; and also all the Monies coming into the Exchequer by Contributions for Annuities and a Lottery granted by One other Act of this Session of Parliament (intituled, An Act for granting to His Majesty the Sum of Two Millions, to be raised by way of Annuities, and a Lottery, and charged on the Sinking Fund, redeemable by Parliament; and for extending to *Ireland* the Laws made in this Kingdom against private and unlawful Lotteries) and also the Sum of Two hundred fifty five thousand nine hundred fifty five pounds, eleven shillings, and eleven pence halfpenny, remaining in the Receipt of the Exchequer, of the Income of the Surplusses, Ecclesies, Overplus Monies, and other Revenues composing the Fund commonly called The Sinking Fund, for the Quarter ended the Fifth Day of April, One thousand seven hundred and fifty six, directed to be issued and applied by One other Act of this Session of Parliament (intituled, An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Sums of Money out of the Sinking Fund; and applying certain Monies remaining in the Exchequer for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and fifty six;) and also the Sum of One million three hundred thousand pounds, by the said Act directed to be issued and applied out of the growing Produce of the said Sinking Fund; and also the Sum of Eighty three thousand four hundred twelve pounds, two shillings, and five pence halfpenny, remaining in the Receipt of the Exchequer, being Money disposeable by Parliament for the Publick Service, and by the said Act directed to be issued
