

The Crown ought not to abuse this trust which is given to it of the Gov. people.

(2) Where there is a great important measure which it is important felt should deal with, but on which the people have not been considered — the constituent power & legislative power are both given to ~~and~~ felt. In constituent measure you have them on the ^{moral} support of public opinion.

(3) Permanent differences between the two houses — if electorate support H of C, the H. of L. cease to object.

When none of these reasons arise it is an abuse of prerog. to exercise it.

Govt. in Council —

Appoint Lieutenant Gov. & held to be act of Gov. This appointment is a royal appointment.

Exercise of the power of pardon. — subject of dispute between Canadian & colonial Secy. Held that Govt. might exercise this power with
