Dear Mr. Ross, -

With further reference to the proposed improvements of the Mt. Eight Destitute I have to inform you that it has been thought advisable not to proceed with the erection of the Boys' play-room this number but to postpore that until next year.

It is thought to be a nature of great importance to remodel the heating apparents before near winter. At present the main building and the extex are heated by separate hot water surfaces, but the one in the main building is irredequate and does not heat the building properly. Must be propose to do is to change the hot water system into a low presente attent system and heat the group of building from a central boiler station, irrelating the proposed new building for the boys' playeroom, which I have just matriored, when it is erected. The cubic contents of this building would be about 43,000 cubic feet, and from this the southward fitters can tell what the strength of the boiler should be. It is highly desirable, therefore, to have a proper heating plan, with an estimate of the cost, in order that the work may be undertaken at as early a date as possible - with a guarantee that it will be completed before it is necessary to use it.
