

SUGGESTED FORMS FOR ENDOWMENTS.

Under the legal constitution of Christ Church Cathedral, Montreal, the successive Rectors of the Church (in addition to their purely ecclesiastical office and designation) are "*A Body Corporate with perpetual succession*," with the special Corporate "*Name of, the Rector of the Parsonage or Rectory and Parish Church of Montreal*". For the purpose of receiving and holding Endowments "of whatever nature and kind" and of "all manner whatsoever," both of "real" and "personal" property, for the Church, "or for other uses or purposes appurtenant thereto." The Cathedral Church, grounds, and Rectory House stand thus, in the Rector's Corporate Name. Of course the conditions under which Bequests or other Endowments are given are left to the discretion of the Donors. The following Forms for Endowments are merely *suggestions*, and may be *varied* at pleasure.

FORM OF BEQUEST OF PERSONAL PROPERTY.

I give and bequeath to "The Rector of the Parsonage or Rectory and Parish Church of Montreal," called Christ Church Cathedral, the sum of

_____ out of my estate, to be paid without any charge or reduction whatever, and to be held forever by the said Rector and his successors in the said Rectory, in their official and corporate capacity, as a Permanent Endowment of the said Church. And I direct that the investment or reinvestment, when necessary, of the said bequest shall be made by the said Rector, in the said capacity, and in accordance with the advice of "the Rector and Church-Wardens" of the said Church, and after conference with the Select Vestry of the said Church; and I further direct that the Annual Income of the said bequest shall be passed through the Accounts of the Church-Wardens of the said Church, and shall be applied to the payment of* _____
