OBITUARY

Obediah Young, formerly of Lake Paul, Kings Co., passed away last December at the home of his daughter in Grendale, Mass., aged 79 years. The body was brought in an air tight metallic casket to Morristown, N. S. and on May 11th was laid beside his wife in the family plot in Morristown cemetery.

Mr. Young is survived by eight sons and two daughters all of whom reside in Massachusetts, except Frank of Aylesford and Harris who lives in Lake Paul. 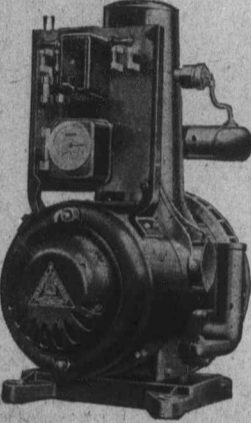
