International Bible Lesson for Tomorrow—Saul, of Tarsus, Converted—Acts 9, 1-12.

Golden Text—Repent ye, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out.

We have in this lesson a marked case of the sovereign grace of God. Paul was small physically—his Roman name means little—filled with religious zeal, blinded by prejudice inspired by the wicked one, like as a tiger that had tasted human blood becomes a man-eater, so Paul lived in an atmosphere of threatenings and slaughter against men and women who loved Jesus Christ. He was perhaps the greatest persecutor of Christians, as he styles himself the Chief of Sinners—1 Tim. 1, 15—but obtained mercy because of his ignorance. The presence of Jesus was as a great search light thrown on Paul's life, blinding his eyes but enlightening his conscience, whose convictions Jesus said he had kicked against. If we do as he did we fight against God also, and He has stricken down many an one before conversion, notably in the Irish revival of 1859. "He that toucheth you toucheth the apple of His eye," Jesus said, "Why persecutest thou Me?" Paul surrenders to Him and becomes a trembling, penitent, obedient believer, a chosen vessel; what a right about face. After three days he is filled with the Spirit; receives his sight and is baptized, God using and honoring Ananias, an humble disciple.
