Was Severe But Canadians Were All Safe, He Said.

(Special Despatch to the Times.) Ottawa, March 15.—The seismograph at the Dominion observatory registered yesterday two earthquake shocks and there are probably the ones referred to in a cablegram received by Mr. F. C. O'Hara, Deputy Minister of Trade and Commerce, last night, from Mr. W. T. R. Preston, Canadian Trade Commissioner at Yokohama. Mr. Preston's cable read: "Severe earthquake, Canadians safe." Allowing for 15 hours' difference in time between Ottawa and Yokohama, the shock in Japan may have been at 9.30 a. m. on Saturday and on 12.42 a. m. on Sunday.

Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations.

A NY person who is the sole holder of a farm, or any other land over 18 years old, may be considered a quarter-section settler under the provisions of the Act. The applicant must appear in person at the local Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at the discretion of the Agency. By father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Entry—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of the homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres. Entry under the Act may be made by his or her mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain conditions a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section containing his homestead. Price \$2.00 per acre. Entry—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry. A homesteader may live within nine miles of the homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres. Entry under the Act may be made by his or her mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain conditions a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section containing his homestead.
