We are pleased to learn that His Majesty's Government has requested that the Newfoundland Naval Reserve should be represented by a detachment at the Coronation as guests of His Majesty's Government during their stay in England. The request is a graceful compliment, paid to, the Ancient Colony as one of the self-governing States of the Empire, and we presume it will be, if it has not already been accepted. It is understood that some 60,000 soldiers and scilous from all parts of the Empire. sailors from all parts of the Empire will be assembled in London to take part in the great historic pageant of the Coronation of King George and his Royal Consort Queen Mary. It will be remembered that His Majesty has appointed our greatest soldier. Field Marshal Viscount Kitchener as Commander in Chief of the Coronatien hosts, and his unique powers of organization are at present being brought to bear in making such ardefenders at home and abroad will take a worthy part in the great event of the year.


