## Cable News.

Special to Evening Telegram.  
ALBANY, To-day.  
William Travers Jerome, formerly  
District Attorney of New York County  
was appointed by Attorney General  
Carmody, Special Deputy Attorney  
General. Jerome was specially de-  
signated to represent the State in pro-  
curing the return of Harry Thaw to  
the New York jurisdiction.

BRUNSWICK, Vt. To-day.  
A forest fire property in Connecti-  
cut Lumber Company broke away  
from three hundred men last night,  
and was driven before a strong south-  
west wind. A valuable growth of  
green timber. By nightfall a mil-  
lion feet of cut timber, much valuable  
standing timber and 1,000 cords  
of hemlock bark and 1,000 acres of  
scrub land had been swept by the  
flames.

LONDON, To-day.  
The Saturday Review, in a leading  
article to-day, savagely attacks Presi-  
dent Wilson's Mexican policy and  
says President Wilson is unconsciously  
playing the game of those in the  
States who want to control Mexican  
politics in order to fill their own pockets.  
Concluding, the article says: "If  
he wishes to plunge his own country  
into war that would last for years,  
drive Mexico back into anarchy, play  
the game of his own political enemies,  
he will continue the present regime.  
On the other side is the alternative of  
accepting a trifling reverse in policy  
of recognising facts. He will have to  
adopt one or the other. Neither may  
be pleasant, but there can be no doubt  
which is recommended by humanity  
and common sense."

MEXICO CITY, To-day.  
Fights between Federalists and Con-  
stitutionalists are reported to have  
taken place during the past twenty-  
four hours. All recorded Federal  
victories, according to official reports,  
the military situation throughout the  
Republic is greatly improved. Rebels  
are said to be generally defeated and  
disheartened and on the defensive in  
all quarters. These official reports  
are practically the only source of in-  
formation on which news for local  
consumption is based. The other side  
of the story rarely reaches the capital  
because of interrupted communication  
and censorship of dispatches at points  
outside the capital.

When a London woman smokes

## Fighting Nature.

What One Man's Patient Effort Wrung  
From a Desert in France.

In the southwest of France, be-  
tween the rivers Adour and Garonne,  
are long stretches of pine woods,  
green and cool.

Where these pines now stand was a  
barren waste in the middle of the last  
century. Sun and wind vied with each  
other in making the land arid and  
dustier. Over the stormy bay of Bis-  
say came winds that set up great  
sandstorms and sometimes buried  
whole villages. The whole region was  
one of hopelessness and despair. Fate  
was against it.

But finally there came a man who  
acknowledged fate only as something  
to be overcome. This man, one Bre-  
montier, was an inspector of roads.  
He began fencing in the desert. He  
began a fence and behind it, planted  
broom seeds. Behind the broom seeds  
he put seeds of the pine. The fence  
protected the broom seeds, and the  
broom grew. Then the broom in its  
turn afforded shelter to the delicate  
pine shoots.

Soon the pines spread, and their  
tough roots bound the sandy soil to-  
gether. The first step was accom-  
plished. Then canals were made to  
drain the wet parts and carry water  
to the dry.

Thus did one man by patient effort  
turn a dreary desert into a home for  
an industrious and healthy population.  
It was an instance of triumph over  
fate. — New York Tribune.

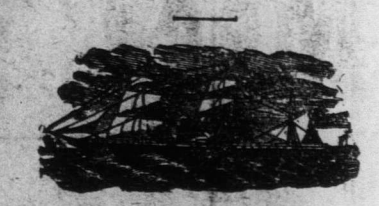
