

## The Labrador Boundary

Editor Evening Telegram.

Dear Sir—The Labrador Boundary dispute has now become "an hardy annual but few of us thought there was so much money being poured out in connection with it as appeared in the list tabled by the Minister of Customs yesterday. It is high time a halt was called to all this unnecessary expenditure. First let us look into the figures opposite the name of one of our carpet knights—Sir P. T. McGrath.

In 1921-22 he received ..... \$6,950.00  
 " 1922-23 " ..... 6,134.77  
 " 1923-24 " ..... 6,770.52

Total for 3 years ..... \$19,855.29

Now let us see how some of our ex-Prime Ministers fared (and they were many of late years). We will first take Mr. W. R. Warren.

In 1921-22 he received ..... \$5,000.00  
 " 1922-23 " ..... 8,001.70  
 " 1923-24 " ..... 3,500.00

Total for 3 years ..... \$16,501.70

In 1922-23, Sir Richard Squires and Lord Marris both received sums of \$50,000 each. Scores of others received sums ranging from \$150 up to \$15,000.00. Who said there was no gold in the Labrador? It must be there and tons of it, but only ex-Prime Ministers and Government officials know where to find it. In striking contrast with the above was the statement made by Sir John Crobie, the Minister of Finance and Customs at a previous sitting of the House. He is quoted as saying that owing to the present condition of the Country's financial affairs and through their being removed illegally by order-in-Council, the duties taken off the common necessary of the fishermen, would have to be reimposed again. Could anything on the part of the late Government be more deserving to censure than this? If I remembered correctly a warning appeared in one of the daily papers (the time these duties were removed) that the action of the then Government was illegal and it was only done for political purposes. Be that as it may, we have the spectacle of tens of thousands of dollars expended every year on Warren, Squires, Morris and McGrath, while the fishermen have to continue paying the duty on flour, pork, beef, etc. In the name of Heaven then let us hand this Labrador Boundary dispute (if dispute there be) over to some competent tribunal and be done with it. What the public want to see now is a thorough "clean up" from the highest to the lowest.

Mr. Kinsella  
 on Overtime

Editor Evening Telegram.

Dear Sir—The figures published from the report of the Hon. the Minister of Finance, as paid to several civil servants for the fiscal period of 1923 to 1924, include \$100.00 to myself from the Department of Posts and Telegraphs, and I am glad of the opportunity to be able to put as plain as I received this amount.

Supt. Kinsella of the Parcel Post Department died in November, 1922 and the present Superintendent, Mr. Galway, was not appointed till May, 1923. Previous to his lamented passing Mr. Kinsella had been absent from his office two months, thus the Superintendent's place was vacant for nine months during which time I did the work and this included four of the busiest months in the year at the Parcel Posts besides attending to my own duties.

The work involved for these nine months was about \$150,000.00, the Superintendent's salary would have totalled \$1,042.20, while I received \$100.00 for this nine months period, or eleven dollars and eleven cents a month. In other words the government saved \$942.20 by holding this position vacant for nine months.

At no time, sir, can the salaries paid the Postal officials or the perquisites (not known there) obtained, be held up to astonish the public. We are the most poorly paid officials in the civil service, and yet ours is the service that is the very public's own.

If there should be an opportunity at any time to earn one hundred dollars, or one hundred cents, and to turn it in a legitimate and perfectly honest way, is there any of the decent thinking public who will resent the poor paid Postal Official from getting this poor amount?

I think not, and to that public I leave the present explanation.

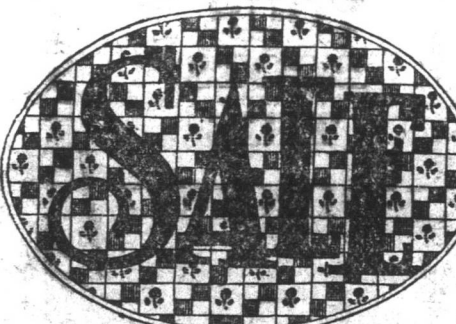
