damage was done to many farms in this neighborhood.

Harvesting is going on at present here, and I am happy to inform you that the crops in this locality are first-rate, owing to the fact that this part of the country has not suffered so much from want of rain as most other places, although the weather has been warm and dry. The farmers in Proton claim that their oats will average fifty bushels to the acre. Our merchants have taken in a very much larger quantity of butter than ever they did before, and the agent who bought up most of the butter in this County, states that the best samples of butter which he got this year were obtained in Priceville.

which he got this year were obtained in Priceville.

The gravel roads are being repaired extensively in many places at the expense of the County. The extra amount of travel between this place and the station last summer and spring cut up that part of the gravel road so much that it became almost impossible to travel in wet weather. Our Reeve was written to about the matter, but I have not been able to find that he ever came to look at it. I believe it is the duty of the Deputy Reeve to look after this part of the road. The people are exasperated at the conduct of the officials in the matter, and say that they will bring it before the County Council. James Edge, Esq., of Glenelg, who is one of the County Valuators, and has been over the whole County this summer, stated lately that the portion mentioned is the worst piece of gravel road that he had seen in the County. A. W. Lauder, M.P.P., has been up feeling his way here again. His visit bas raised some speculation as to who shall oppose him at the next election. The feeling throughout the riding is against running an outside man.
