Many Girls are Helped. From these homes as centres, about the past year 65 girls have been taken into our homes, almost all of them remaining a few months, and they have here received protection and help. Of these, several were token from most degrading conditions—physical, mental, and spiritual wrecks—very often having come originally from homes of luxury and refinement. Others were, through the kindness of the authorities, sent into our cheery surroundings in preference to sending them to jail. Through visiting the jail weekly, 140 girls have been reached. During jail. Through visiting the jail weekly, many, on having served their sentence, have come to us until we could secure suitable positions for them. Different departments of the Children's Aid throughout the province have sent to us girls who were in serious danger, to be kept as long as seemed desirable or wise. A large number have been brought into our homes from the hospitals on being discharged, when they were without means of support, or had become mothers.
