

The Everett smelter has entered into a contract with the California Sampling Works, of San Francisco, to handle 1,-500 tons of the latter institution's ores and concentrates every 30 days for a period of 18 months. The vessels of the Pollard line are to transport the material, which is, the product of the quartz mines of California, Nevada, New Mexico, Mexico and two or three South American states. The first ship-

New Mexico, Mexico and two or three South American states. The first ship-ment, 500 tons, under this contra 4 is coming on the steamer Newburg, which sailed from San Francisco for Seattle last night. Three other vessels of the Pollard line are to be engaged from time to time in the transportation of the ores and concentrates. They are the steamers Rainier, Coronado and West-port. The latter has never been in this port, though the Rainier and Coroaado are running regular between Puget Sound and San Francisco. No small proportion of the are comes







