Official Statement By War Office of Casualties During War.

Twenty-Eight Thousand Men Permanently Incapacitated Or Dead.

London, June 5.—The official statement issued by the War Office this evening shows that the total reduction of British forces in South Africa up to May 30 of the present year, was 97,477. This includes killed, prisoners, deaths from disease, and men sent home. Of these, many have rejoined their regiments, leaving 28,434 dead, or permanently incapacitated
