It looks as if the Deep Waterway

Convention will be a success both in

attendance and in enthusiasm. It is but a week

or two since the people of the United

States were made aware of our proposal

to hold the convention, and the

fact that they have already manifested in the

project is highly satisfactory. When the

Liberal party first propounded their

Commercial Union idea there was no

evidence of American sympathy with the

Cartwright-Winnipeg policy. Except Ben

Cartwright, who did not recall any

United States public man, or any

representative business man, who came over

here, or who manifested any interest

in the project. Quite different is

in regard to the deep waterway

proposal. Considering the difficulty there is in

getting any question fairly before the

people, we have no reason to complain of

the impression that has already been

made on the other side of the line. It is

pretty certain there will be a large

attendance from Canadian cities and towns

and the Americans will at least send a

respectable representation, including

men who understand the question

thoroughly. We must not expect too much of the

convention. If it has the effect of

introducing the question to the

attention of the people of both countries the

object has been accomplished. It

is to make the attendance at the

convention as large and representative

as possible. We are sorry the committee

has not seen fit to advertise the

convention more extensively.
