OUR ANAPOLIS FLEET.—The ships Lawrence Delap and Isabella Motz, bark; Hamilton, John; Stafford, Transit, Palermo, and S. J. Bogart are now on the voyage from New York to ports in Europe and Great Britain, grain laden.

The bark Carrie Delap, Arturus, E. D. Bigelow, and I. W. Oliver are loading grain on this side for Europe. The combined cargoes of these vessels foot up 95,000 qtrs., say 760,000 bushels of grain, and their freight amounts to \$2,000,000, or \$15,000,000, and "more to follow."
