Mrs. Tansey, of Swan Lake, Manitoba, writes to Mrs. Williamson thus: "I trust you will excuse a stranger troubling you, but I am appealing on behalf of our mission. It is very large, there being six different places of service, three each Sunday, fifty miles driving one week, and thirty the next. The people are very poor, some have not sold one bushel of grain for years, having lost all by hail or frost. A number did not even raise their potatoes last year, and have only a few cattle to depend upon, which means a very poor maintenance, especially when there are children, and there are very many in this mission I do not like this long cold winter to pass without trying to do something for them, and shall be most grateful for help in any way, and shall be glad to answer any questions upon our work and its needs."
