bolus. This, as we have said, is hopeful.

No one school is big enough to contain the whole truth. It is wise, then, to utilize what is good in all and to combine for that purpose. When the day comes that "the whole medical profession will be one," as Dr. Fowler says, perhaps the mortality lists will not be so large — Ex.
