necessary appointments shall be entrusted to a third Power, chosen by agree ment between the parties, or on request of the parties, to the Acting President of the Council of the League of Nations.

2. If no agreement is reached on either of these procedures, each party shall designate a different Power, and the appointment shall be made in concert

by the Powers thus chosen.

3. ARTICLE 7.

2. The application, after giving a summary account of the subject dispute, shall contain the invitation to the Commission to take all necessary

measures with a view to arriving at an amicable solution.

3. If the application emanates from only one of the parties, the other party shall, without delay, be notified by it.

ARTICLE 8.

1.
