On January 25, Mr. MacEachen said that "the objective of the Canadian delegation to Davos will be to promote a favourable image of Canada as a stable trade partner with a strong resurgent economy and as a secure place to invest". Particular emphasis will be placed on the new technology, energy and sophisticated service sectors.

Today Messrs MacEachen, Regan and Mrs. Ostry will participate in the brainstorming session on Managing the Recovery at 1630 hours.

Tomorrow, Prime Minister Pierre Elliott Trudeau will lead off the plenary for world leaders in discussing how we can unblock the international security situation in 1984. Prime Minister Trudeau has undertaken a personal initiative to lesson East/West tension which has taken him to many capitals around the world. He arrives in Davos from Prague and next week will visit Romania and the German Democratic Republic.
