LOUISVILLE, May 8.—Many notables in 'turf circles of the United States are gathered in Louisville to witness the fortieth annual Kentucky Derby at one mile and a quarter, which will be run tomorrow afternoon at Churchill Downs track. Interest in this event this year appears greater than ever before, owing to the fact, that the purse is the largest in the history of the Derby. Horsemen declare the entries comprise one of the most remarkable bands of three-year-olds ever brought together in a race in this country.

With \$10,000 added this year the purse will reach appreximately \$13,500, or about \$10,000 to the winner. Out of 47 eligibles there are ten horses which their owners have declared are certain to start, and two or three others which may go to the post. The favorite appears to be Old Rosebud, owned by W. C. Applegate of Louisville, which will carry 114 pounds, and is quoted at about 7 to 5. Ivan Gardner, owned by C. S. Wilson, Chicago, is assigned top weight, due to winning this season's Palmetto Derby. Among other entries favored in the betting are Hodge, owned by Kay Spence, Missouri; Surprising, owned by R. F. Carman, New York and Belloc, owned by James MacManus, the California turfman.
