BORDEN'S WESTERN TOUR

Brought to a Close

Has Always Held Clear Course on Reciprocity and War Respect Even Opponents.

WINNIPEG, July 7.—(Special.)

The western tour of the Conservative leader closed this evening at Somerset. During the last three weeks he has held nearly forty public meetings and spoken at as many more gatherings of grain growers or municipal receptions. He has always held the same clear course wherever he has gone and has won the respect of even the most hostile audiences. He has met the grain growers in more than a dozen points in the three provinces. Everywhere they have repeated their approval of the reciprocity agreement and frequently their desire to see the Conservatives withdraw their opposition to it.

It was not until Mr. Borden reached Alberta that he received any comments on his announcement of policy in Winnipeg. There and since he has in a number of instances been thanked for his attitude on the Hudson Bay Railway terminal elevators, and the chief of the local business community. In a good many instances the memorials presented have been those sent to the government by the grain growers' organizations, but in a larger number of cases more frequently they have been the work of the local business community. In Alberta they asked for terminal facilities for the Pacific and for direct legislation for the Hudson Bay Railway. In the other provinces and in the United States they have given Mr. Borden an opportunity to appear to them on their principles to the reciprocity pact.

Opposition to Pact

During the tour a number of Conservative associations announced their opposition to the agreement. In Saskatchewan several of the Conservative members of the legislature, who had assented to the reciprocity pact, withdrew their names from the list of assenters. Mr. Borden's reception by the public was uniformly enthusiastic. The audience was the personal point of view. In the agencies in Saskatchewan and Alberta there was a fair representation of opponents of reciprocity.

In Manitoba the meetings showed a tendency to divide between Liberals and Conservatives. Even the grain growers' deputations contained opponents of reciprocity.

Three meetings were held to-day. On Monday, in the morning, Portage la Prairie in the afternoon, and in St. Pierre in the evening. The evening meeting at Portage la Prairie was attended by about two hundred persons. Both political parties were represented and members of the audience were in a friendly mood. At the close of the meeting, after the customary cheers had been given for Mr. Borden, a gift in the audience was offered to Mr. Borden and they were heartily given, their volume did not reach those of the Conservative leader.

Mr. Borden made another reference to the grain growers' memorial at Dauphin, inspired by Roderick Mackenzie, provincial secretary of the organization, who had alleged that Mr. Borden had pledged only himself and not his party to the building of the Hudson Bay Railway and its operation by a state commission.
