Toronto is likely to have lots of litigation on her hands before the end of the year.

The Court of Appeal has reserved judgment in the Ontario Forge & Bolt Company's suit against the Comet Cycle Company.

It is said that the late P. J. Brown's debts are being liquidated.

The case of Patrick v. Walbourne, Chief Justice Meredith upheld the finding of Falconbridge, J., stating that although a mechanic's lien is against the owner binds his estate and interest for the full price of the work or material, the mortgagee's security is not affected unless the value of the land is increased by the work or material.

In McGuinness v. Dufay, an action brought against a Justice of the Peace for alleged malicious arrest and false imprisonment, judgment was reserved on appeal.

The creditors of George A. Chrysler, drygoods, Brantford, will meet in Assignee Langley's office today, when a settlement will probably be arrived at. The assets are about \$12,000, with liabilities nominally the same.

Advances in Teachers' Salaries.

The Finance Committee of the Public School Board will report at the next board meeting, recommending that all teachers receiving less than \$200 per annum shall receive an advance of \$24 per annum in 1896, in accordance with last year's schedule. All female assistants receiving \$400 and upwards will receive no advance. Male assistants receiving \$350 will have the schedule advance of \$25, but all principals, caretakers and officials will receive no increase.

Judge McDougall gave judgment yesterday in the suit of E. R. C. Clarkson against the firm of Beiding, Paul & Co., dismissing the action with costs. Plaintiff asked that \$200 worth of goods, obtained by defendants from the worsted and Hraid Company, which assigned to Mr. Clarkson last August, should be declared to have been the property of the latter company at the time of the assignment and should have been included in the goods assigned.
