Preposed New Tewnship.

The project of forming a new township of Swansea and a portion of Eboblooke is being favorably considered by a number of property-holders, who feel that they are not receiving a fair share of support from the York Township Council. New York, Feb. 24.—Two Americans who arrived from Southampton yesterday tell a story of cruelty experienced on board a British ship. They say they were kidnapped and so were other shipmates. The men are John Walters of Detroit and Edward Mitchell of San Antonio, Texas. Walters and Mitchell say that one man was killed on board the vessel. The man who died on board from the effects of ill-treatment was Charles Bowman, an American, who came from Minnesota. Bowman, it seemed, was in Mobile, looking for a ship when he was accosted by Mate Fraser. After some talk Fraser asked him to shake hands with him and in doing so clapped a pair of handcuffs on him hurried him into a boat and took him on board the handcuffs were removed. Selzing a favorable opportunity Bowman managed to get ashore, but was pursued by the captain, recaptured and taken back to the ship. On the voyage out malarial fever developed and Bowman lay up in the forecastle. According to the statements made Mate Fraser went below, pulled Bowman out of his berth, struck him, kicked him and knocked him down. As a result of the beating Bowman was laid up for two days. Wheat opened on a down turn this mornling with first sales at 75 cents for May. Mitchell, Frazier, Canby, Milmine and others became good buyers and advanced the market to 75½. A lot of sculpers followed and got long. Later Barrett turned sellers. Logan had lot of wheat to sell. Booth, Baldwin, Farker and a large crowd of followers sold. This put the price down to 73% around 1 p.m. Liverpool cables were firm at ½d higher, while the late private cables were unchanged. Export inquiry today was hardly manifest, but values are approaching a price that may lead to some business soon. The volume of trade, aside from the local operations, was so light that when the longs tried to unload there was no one to take the offerings. There was about 25,000 bushels cash wheat sold to millers.

If other business was done it was not reported. New York reported no export sales. CHICAGO GOSSIP.

Blying orders for wheat were received from London to-day. Kansas crop is about 3 per cent. less than last year's average, but the condition is a considerable per cent. better and the state has been liberally covered with snow. Prospects for growing crop are quite favorable. It is believed that France will have to import large quantities of wheat during the balance of crop season. Recent government's report giving reduced winter area in France and poor condition of wheat plant to be expected. Even with most favorable conditions from now on we can only expect a moderate crop. For balance of crop year we estimate imports into France at 25 to 35 million. There is a more peaceful aspect to the Cretan question. One local house claim that they are receiving orders for spring wheat from Illinois and Missouri to replace winter wheat.
