There was a very large attendance of representatives from the subordinate courts within the territory of the new High Court, and great inthusiasm prevailed among the delegates, consequent upon the organization of the new High Court. The Supreme Chief Ranger, oninvitation, afterwards proceeded to Detroit, where he initiated on Thursday night, at a union meeting of the courts held in the Foresters' Temple of that city, 153 candidates. Thursday was a record day at the head office of the order, where the Supreme Physician, Dr. Millman, and his staff, received and disposed of during the day 512 applications for membership. It is needless to say that the staff were kept hard at work till a late hour of the night, the rule being to dispose of all applications on the day they are received. The Supreme Physician expects to close the work of the month of December with over \$000 applications for membership, the largest number that has ever been received in any one month.
