THE LOCAL MARKET

New lines of vegetables and fruit were features of the local market today. The attendance was small because of the rain, but a good quantity of produce was brought to the city. New cabbages were offered for the first time, and brought from 20c to 25c first time, and brought from 20c to 25c a head. The demand was fairly brisk. Horne-grown cucumbers were also sold for the first time this season. They brought from 12c to 15c each. Imported tomatoes brought from 15c a box up, according to the quality. Potatoes were not as plentiful as usual, and the price was firmer at \$4 to \$4.50 a bag. It is likely to remain at that level or go to a higher one until supplies of new potatoes are offered.

Lettuce for 50c to 75c a dozen heads. Rhubarb was fairly plentiful at 30c a dozen bunches.

Asparagus was slightly cheaper at 60c a dozen bunches.

Spinach was unchanged at 20c a peck. Gooseberries at 15c a box appeared as the first home-grown fruit offering this season. Only a few boxes were offered and they had a brisk sale.

Strawberries were scarce.

The supply of butter was good and prices were slightly easier. Creamery butter retailed for 42c and 43c a pound. The wholesale price was 33c a pound. Pound rolls of dairy butter retailed for 37c to 38c, while wholesale quantities brought from 35c to 36c a pound. Crock butter was sold retail for 35c and 36c a pound. The wholesale price varied from 34c to 35c.
