Heinousness of Sin Ignored, Says Layman.

## DISTRICT MEETING HELD

Evangelism Topic for Morning Session of Methodist Gathering.

A social service and temperance convention of the Methodist Church in this district met Thursday in the Memorial Church. The morning session was devoted to evangelism. W. W. Chown, chairman of the Laymen's Evangelistic Union, delivering an address on this subject, in the absence of Dr. Moore, who was unable to attend. He opened his address with a brief account of the purpose and workings of the Evangelistic Union, stating that it was organized by people in the city who thought that the laymen of the Methodist Church were not doing enough in the line of evangelism. The object of this union is twofold, to make the members themselves stronger spiritually, and to be in readiness to help the pastors, who require it in their work. Mr. Chown spoke of a group of such men in Louisville, Ky., who were called Yoke Fellows, and who even went so far as to fill the pulpits of ministers, when occasions required. In speaking of the necessity of obtaining the power of the holy ghost, he said that the church right, he advised preaching which would make the people see the heinousness of sin, touching on the old-time ministers, who preached hell fire, and pointing out that the modern preaching was taking too far away from this old idea. After the address the delegates retired to another part of the church where luncheon was served.

## SOLDIERS TRAINING HERE PROVE SELVES REAL ENTERTAINERS

A most enjoyable event in every way was the assault-at-arms put on by the soldiers at the armories last evening to raise funds for the purchase of prizes for the weekly athletic tournaments of the men at Queen's Park Camp.

In addition to giving an insight into the many phases of the life of a soldier, the program contained many amusing features and also a number of musical selections by the band of the 1st Depot Battalion, W.O.R.A., and by the Army Medical Corps string orchestra.

Boxing, bayonet fighting, wrestling and physical training games were interesting features that won applause from the audience of civilians and soldiers present.

Refreshments were served by the members of the Overseas Chapter, I. O. O. E., under the direction of Mrs. Galbraith and Mrs. Clinger, and were much appreciated.

Much credit for the success of the evening is due to Capt. Cantin and Sergeant-Major Green and his staff of instructors, who spent much time in preparing the men for the event.

One of the funniest features of the program was the blindfold boxing bouts, in which the clowns joined, and another laughable feature the pillow fighting bouts, which were fought on a man's back.

In view of the fact that the men are expected to get out and leave for overseas almost any day, the affair was in the nature of a farewell exhibition, as far as London is concerned, and though a fair-sized crowd was present, it was felt that London's citizens should turn out and support such affairs more enthusiastically than they did this one.

Only those men living in Canada may obtain assistance for their families from the Canadian patriotic fund, and forms of application for such funds should not be furnished to men whose dependents are in the United States, according to camp orders, where recruiting officers are warned that they should not issue the forms to such men.

The American Red Cross and one or two special auxiliaries are attending to the wants of the dependents of American soldiers in the Canadian forces.
