MEDALS PRAISES TANLAC.

RUSSO-POLISH CONFERENCE TO TALK PEACE

Preliminaries Are Being Arranged—Boundary Commission Is Already Appointed.

LONDON, Sept. 26.—(By the Associated Press.)—The Russo-Polish conference is expected to answer the Polish counter-proposal. M. Joffe, having read to this at M. Domb'ski's request, in spite of the fact that the Poles are ready to answer the Moscow declaration presented on Friday. The conference will begin working out the details of preliminary peace proposals with a view to the joint boundary commission after the preliminary session. Both the Poles and the Poles considering it necessary to dispose of the question of the line of demarcation. The boundary commission is the first one yet appointed. M. Joffe is naming the Poles, who would appoint their members of the other commissions later.

Neither delegation showed activity today. The Russians rested, while several of the Poles, including M. Domb'ski, went hunting.

STRIKE PICKETS OF TEXTILE WORKERS IN POLICE COURT

Fifteen Stratford Women Are Charged With Following Florence Rodwell in Disorderly Manner.

STRATFORD, Sept. 25.—A sequel to the textile workers' strike, which has been in progress for three weeks, has been in police court on Friday when 15 women of the Avon Hosiery Company, fifteen of whom are on strike, were charged with persistently following Miss Rodwell from place to place to compel her to assist them.

The charge was read for "following Florence Rodwell in a disorderly manner through Wellington street, Dufferin street and other streets of the city of Stratford, Ontario, on or about the 21st day of September, 1920." The cases were set over until Tuesday.

Stratford's total assessment for the year, according to returns made available today by Assessor Tustan, has mounted to \$13,329,300, which is an increase over last year of \$1,317,145. The total is valued at \$2,820,000, an increase of \$375,510, and the buildings at \$9,077,640, an increase of \$1,761,835. The population figures show the city is still growing and is fast nearing the 19,000 mark. The total is now 18,871, an increase of 765. The amount of taxable property is \$12,459,224, an increase of \$2,077,784. The taxable real, all purposes, is \$1,292,125, an increase of \$147,413; taxable, total, schools, \$1,142,824.

CHATHAM, Sept. 26.—Henry B. Smith, of Bay City, Mich., president of the Dominion Sugar Company, died at his residence in Chatham, Ontario, on Friday, Sept. 24, at the age of 78.

Mr. Smith was a prominent business man in Chatham and was a member of the board of trustees of the Soldiers' fund, which was organized for the purpose of raising money for the distribution of the fund along with the G. W. V. A. Up to the present time, Mr. Smith had been one of the most active organizers of the fund.

WRITE FOR \$25,000 DAMAGES ISSUED

BY DR. CHERNIAK

Well-Known Windsor Physician Alleges Ruffianism On Part of Officer.

CHARGES FALSE ARREST

Complainant in Court Action Is Graduate of Western University.

WINDSOR, Sept. 26.—Charging that he was brutally assaulted by a special inspector sent to the border ostensibly to round up rum-runners, that the officer discharged his gun at him and that he suffered false arrest and imprisonment, Dr. Isidor Cherniak, 121 Ouellette avenue, a well-known local physician, has instituted suit for \$25,000 damages against the Board of License Commissioners, Toronto, employers of the special inspector, and the latter himself, G. S. Ball, Cherniak is also pressing two charges in police court against Ball, alleging that the latter assaulted him and fired his revolver at him with intent to do grievous bodily harm.

The suit and two criminal charges, which are to be proceeded with upon the arrival here of R. L. Brackin, M. L. A., of Chatham, are the outcome of a recent experience late at night, when Dr. Cherniak returned to the building in which he resides and in which his offices are located, to find a strange man in civilian clothes searching an automobile belonging to one of the tenants of the house.

Thought Officer Thief. Returning from a professional call near midnight, the doctor, noticing the man, and thinking he might be stealing something from the car, approached him and asked him his business. He was met with refusal and when he refused to leave without seeing the car, the man's identity and purpose, the latter struck him twice, twice flat blows in the ribs, and the doctor, in the confusion, struck the man with his fist. When the doctor refused to comply with the order because he was not a member of the officer's identity, the latter, according to the physician and eyewitnesses of the incident, drew his revolver into the ground near Dr. Cherniak.

When the physician, believing he was the victim of a bandit, attempted to break loose from the hold of Ball, who, the story says, was forcing him into the car, the doctor was struck twice over the head, cursed at him, grabbed him by the neck and arm, and threw him into the car. Then the gun was once more brought into play, and Cherniak was ordered to "drive to the station."

Wouldn't Show Badge. When Mrs. Herbert Jensen, one of the occupants of the house arrived and advised Dr. Cherniak to accompany the physician, the physician said he would not go, as he was not a member of the officer's identity, and the only reply he received was more blows.

The doctor says he expected to be taken to the Windsor police station, where he was ordered to drive on. When he asked for an explanation, the officer said he was a member of the officer's identity, and the doctor was ordered to drive on.

Since the incident Dr. Cherniak has been under the care of a brother physician, to whom he was forced to go to his home, and he has been treated.

It has since developed police refused to release him until a Friday morning, when he was hurriedly taken to the hospital, where he was treated by a specialist.

Dr. Cherniak is well known in London, where he graduated a few years ago from Western University.

Issue of the writs against Ball and the board of license commissioners, Ontario, is to be made this week by R. L. Brackin, M. L. A., counsel for Dr. Cherniak.

PREMIER REPLIES TO COMPLAINTS REGARDING GRAVEL REMOVAL

SARNIA, Sept. 26.—A letter from Premier Drury states that licenses to remove sand and gravel from the St. Clair River have been issued to seven companies by the department of mines. The companies are: The St. Clair River Gravel Company, Ltd., and in the country have been made, and resolutions passed urging conservation of resources.

Lambton County Council and the Moore Township Council. The premier's letter states that the companies have been granted licenses as follows: Superior Sand and Gravel Company, Cameron Steamship Company, Caldwell Gravel Company, Limited, International Sand and Gravel Company, Chick Contracting Company, Limited, United Gravel Supply Company, Limited, and the Marysville Land Company.

The licenses all terminate on December 31, in the year in which they are issued, and carry an obligation to make returns periodically to the department of the quantities of material removed in respect of which they are charged a royalty, the payment of which is secured to the department by the different licenses furnishing bonds of approval. The department states that the charge this year has been increased to 15 cents per cubic yard from 12 cents last year.

470 Building Permits. To date 470 building permits have been issued this year. The permits were issued during the entire twelve months of 1919. Up to date this month 1,119 permits have been issued, totaling in value \$46,130.
