DUTCH AUTOGRAPHERS SAY EX-KAISER WILL NEVER BE TRIED

WILSON'S MESSAGE HAS NOT AFFECTED TREATY DEALINGS... Efforts to Secure Compromise Ratification Again Determined Undertaken.

Depreciation of Mark Erecting Higher Barrier than Protective Tariff—Commission at Hague to Arrange for Credits.

THE TURKS OUT OF EUROPE PUZZLES ALLIES

U. S. Mandate Given Up and Entente Seeking Some Other Solution.

HOLLAND WILL FIRMLY REFUSE TO SURRENDER THE EX-KAISER

Dutch Chamber Wants Wilhelm Out Official Demand From Allies Expected in Ten Days, But Right of Political Refuge Will Not Be Given Up—Precedents Lacking—Country Would Be Glad to Be Rid of Him.

Washington, Jan. 9.—The fortunes of the treaty of Versailles became even more unsettled today when on top of President Wilson's Jackson Day pronouncement for taking the question to the people in the political campaign, and William Jennings Bryan's opposition to such a course, Democratic and Republican friends of the treaty in the senate renewed determinedly their effort to secure a compromise ratification.

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The Hague, Jan. 9.—The first chamber of the Dutch parliament has drafted and presented to the cabinet a memorandum suggesting that it now is desirable that Holland request former Emperor William of Germany to return to his own country.

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
