In opening, his scheme for extending our West India Trade to Foreigners, Mr. Robinson announced his intention, and obtained leave accordingly, to introduce two Bills into Parliament. A printed copy of one of these (as pending in the House of Commons at our latest dates) we have seen; but the Bill proposed that is to regulate the Trade between Europe and His Majesty's Possessions in America and the West Indies, we believe has not reached this country. We offer to our readers the following outline of the most interesting parts of the Bill, with the perusal of which we have been favoured.

A Bill to regulate the Trade between His Majesty's Possesions in America and the West Indies, and other Places in America and the West Indies, and other Places in America and the West Indies, and other Places in American Trade are repealed, including the Free Port Acts of Beraudu. Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick.

Into certain Coloinal Ports, not named, but to be specified, in a Table referred to, certain Articles also to be specified in another Table, may be imported from all foreign Places in the West Indies and on the Continent of America, in British Vessels, and in such foreign Vessels only as belong to, and come directly from, the Country of which the imported Articles are the growth, produce, or manufacture.

Out of the same Colonial Ports, any Articles of whatsoever

or manufacture.
Out of the same Colonial Ports, any Articles of whatsoever nature (Arms and Naval Stores excepted) may be experted by any British or foreign Vessels, provided that the foreign Vessels give Bonds to carry direct, and deliver their cargoes at some Port or Ports in the Country or State to which such Vessels respectively may belong; the Port or Ports of delivery to be specified in the Clearance and Bonds given at the shipment.

The certain Articles imported as above, into the certain Colonial Ports, may, in British Vessels only, be carried to any other British Port of America or the West Indies, proof being produced in such cases that the Duties there on have been regularly paid at the first Place of their importation. And such imported Articles may also be carried from such Colonies to the United Kingdom, under the Rules, Restrictions, and Conditions established by the following-Statutes, viz. 12th Charles 2d, 22d and 23d Charles 2d, and 20th George 3d.

The Privileges given to foreign Ships are confined to the Vessels of such Nations only as afford the like Privileges to British Ships to their Ports; for which purpose His Majesty may by Order in Council at any time suspend the open tion of this Act in favour of the Vessels of any Nation, when it may appear to His Majesty that British Vessels do not in the Ports of such Nation or Country, enjoy the like Privileges as are herein afforded to foreign Vessels, and also increase the number of Ports into which such Importations may be made.

Forfeitures of Vessels and Cargoes incurred, in case of importation into the Colonies beyond the limitations of this Act.

No aliusion is made to any Duty on foreign Tonnage entering Colonial Ports.

The overseer a few days before his death, had sent him some raw meat and Indian meal, but the wretched man, being unable to cook it, was obliged to devour it undressed. The neighbours, we are sorry to un-derstand, did not extend the fostering hand of charity, and amidst the horrors of a loathsome disease, and the gloom of solitude and poverty, he was allowed miserably to expire. Mrs. Powell, whose humanity to the unfortunate is as well known and conspicuous as her hospitality to strangers, did not know of the poor man's situation until human assistance was too late, and he had rendered his soul to his Maker. In the absence of the Coroner,

S. C. Hewes, Esq. the body was interred without any Inquest being held.

On the evening of the 13th May, as a Sailing Boat was descending the Harbour of the Richibucto, with a strong wind, it was suddenly overset, and a lad who was in it of the name of Richard, of French parents, aged 16, was unfortunately drowned.
