MUCH DAMAGE FROM STORM

F. H. J. Ruel's Launch Sunk, Trees Uprooted and Fences Razed -- Schr. Keewaydin Ashore.

The first October storm did considerable damage.

Fences were sent to the ground, trees were felled and telephone wires were crossed.

The waves rolled high in the harbor, and they broke heavily over the cotton factory wharf at the foot of Clarence street.

A staging with a portion of a roof and a wall was carried away by the huge waves off the breakwater, and a number of men by means of boats endeavored to gather the debris, most of which found their way to sea.

The high wind took a few trees from the burial ground lot by the roots and laid them on the walks.

About 7:45 o'clock last night the electric lights went out and many churches were left in darkness and the motor power was cut off from the organs.

Some of the European technical journals describe a new method of exploding mines based upon the action of sound-waves.

It is known from laboratory experiments that if a disk which is free to turn about its diameter is placed inside a cylindrical resonator, and the fundamental note is sounded the disk will place itself in a plane perpendicular to the cylinder.

By causing such a turning disk, governed by sound-waves, to complete an electric circuit, it would be possible for a warship to explode a mine by giving a certain signal on a siren, tuned to the same note as that of the resonator.
