#### NEW PROPOSAL FOR CONFERENCE TO FURTHER A GENERAL PEACE

Stockholm, Nov. 26.—T. Stauning, min-  
ister without portfolio in the Danish  
cabinet, and who also is leader of the  
Danish Socialist party, has written Pietr  
Trotsky, Dutch Socialist leader, and C.  
Husman, a Belgian Socialist and secre-  
tary of the International Socialist Con-  
gress, proposing the holding of a con-  
ference of the Socialist Internationale in  
December with the ostensible purpose of  
furthering a general peace.

M. Stauning, however, admits that the  
possibility of securing delegates from  
countries other than Russia, Finland and  
the Central Powers and some neutral  
states is limited. He adds that "peace  
on the east front does not lie outside the  
bounds of possibility."

Hjalmar Branting, Swedish minister  
of finance, in his newspaper, the Social  
Demokraten, strongly criticizes the pro-  
posed plan, declaring that it is unjusti-  
fiable to engage the services of the Social-  
ist Internationale in such a proceeding,  
which might lengthen the war.

Schmittberger Left \$6,000.  
New York, Nov. 27.—The will of Max  
F. Schmittberger, chief inspector of the  
New York police department, shows that  
his entire estate consisted of \$6,000 in  
personal property, of which \$2,000 goes  
to Woodlawn cemetery for the upkeep  
of the family burial plot. Anne M.  
Schmittberger, daughter, gets two-  
fifths of the residue and the remainder  
is divided among his sons, with the ex-  
ception of his son, Franklin, who gets  
only \$1.
