## Fine Arts Department.

Adequate provision is made for a thorough course of instruction in Vocal and Instrumental Music, and in Painting, in both water colors and oil, Drawing, &c., &c.

The Professor of Music is an excellent pianist and organist, a superior vocalist, and a most faithful and successful teacher. The Institution is well supplied with pianos and other instruments of music necessary to allow pupils the most favorable opportunity for practice.

The Teacher of Drawing, Painting, &c., is a lady highly accomplished and eminently successful in her department of instruction.

Pupils who become proficients either in Music, or in Drawing and Painting, will be entitled to receive Special Certificates.

## Domestic Arrangements, &c.

The Vice-Principal and his family, as well as the Chief Preceptress and other Teachers, live in immediate and constant connection with this Academic family.

The family and class organizations are entirely distinct from those of the other Academy, and the students of the different Branches are not allowed to associate, except in accordance with well considered and established regulations under official direction.

Parents and guardians of young ladies may feel assured, that while the most strenuous efforts will be made to secure the development and strengthening of all the mental powers, and for the formation of right general habits, and a high principled, moral—a Christian—character, due attention will also be given to the preservation of the health and the cultivation of refined taste and lady-like manners.

Students unaccompanied by a teacher are not allowed to visit any family except by special request of parents or guardians.
