Jury, After Three Hours' Deliberation, Finds Her Guilty of Murder

ROBERVAL, P. Q., June 20— Emily Sprague, found guilty of the murder of her husband, Abraham Gallop, who died at He Maligne on Aug. 6, 1925, was sentenced here yesterday by Mr. Justice Gibson, to be hanged on Oct. 15. The verdict was rendered after the jury had deliberated for three hours. Abraham Gallop, an employe of the Duke Price Company, was a native of Kingsfield, N.B. On the morning of August 6, last year, he died under circumstances that aroused the suspicions of the police.

BURIED IN N. B.

His body was taken to Kingsfield and buried, but later, under instructions of the Department of the Quebec Attorney-General, the corpse was exhumed and an examination made. The result of this examination showed, according to evidence sworm to in court

It was brought out during the evidence that strychnine had been bought by Gallop, who intended to employ it in hunting foxes, and it was also stated that a bottle of strychnine, the contents undisturbed, had been sent by Gallop to a friend.

The sentence of death passed upon Mrs. Emily Sprague Gallop at Roberval recalls to citizens of this province the fact that it is over a quarter of a century since a woman was executed in Quebec.

The last case was that of Cordelia Viau, who went to the scaffold at Stescholastique at the beginning of the present century for the slaying of her husband. It was a dual execution, Sam Parsclow dying at the hands of the executioner at the same time and for complicity in the same crime. The trial was a "cause celebre," creating a great sensation at that time.
