When the Shereef of Mecca, the oldest living descendant of Mohammed, started the Arabian revolution in 1916, Lawrence saw the possibility of creating an irregular army of Bedouins mounted on racing camels and fleet Arabian horses. On the pretext of wanting a two-weeks leave of absence he left Cairo and boldly made his way into the heart of forbidden and Holy Arabia. There he presented himself to Emir Feisal, the energetic son of the aged Shereef of Mecca, who was in command of the Arab forces. The result of the meeting was that Lawrence never returned to his old job in Cairo. His European costume discarded, garbed in 'wing robes and sandals he remained in the desert, and within a few months became the real head and brains of the Arabian revolution.

For hundreds of years, the wild tribes of the desert had been engaged in terrible blood-feuds. Even the leaders of the tribe of Koresh, who, as descendants of the Prophet, are supposed to stand high in the esteem of all Mohammedans, were unable to check the never-ending local wars. But young Lawrence, by skilful diplomacy and a modesty and daring which excited the admiration of the Bedouins and appealed to their imaginations, miraculously succeeded in getting the normad people of the desert to throw aside their jealousies, their century-old feuds, and unite against their hated common enemy, the Turk.

Lawrence led his wild Arabian cavalry in a dozen pitched battles and unnumbered raids. Usually he charged at the head of them on a giant white camel. He had six bullet holes in different parts of his body, and all of his wounds were forced to heal themselves without medical attention. On one occasion, at the head of a handful of Arabs, he cut a picked Turkish regiment to pieces in the desert near the rose-red city of Petra. Another time he captured the small Turkish Dead Sea fleet when the unsuspecting crews were all ashore. So far as I know, it is the only instance in history where a fleet was forced to surrender to cavalry.


