ATTRACTIVE FOR SMALL GIRLS.



yoke of the same material, the sleeves being cut into one with the yoke. Belt, collar and cuffs are of the plaid, and the neck may be finished in either high or low effect.

To make the dress requires:
3/4 yards 28-inch material at 36c. yard \$0.28
1/2 yard plaid for trimming at 40c. yard \$0.20

Since the vest is an adjustable affair, this may be transferred from dress to dress.

When 28-inch material is used, it can be folded to splendid advantage in cutting out the dress. The skirt being a straight flounce, it can be arranged about 2 inches from the edge of the sponge, on the fold. The pleating follows next, being laid a little further toward the open edge. The back and sleeve (in one piece) is laid on a fold of the goods. The round collar, cuffs, pleating for back and sleeve and front are all arranged on a lengthwise thread of the material.

Now, to make the dress, first gather the upper and lower edges of front and lower edge of back between double "TT" perforations. Sew upper edge of front to back and sleeve section, notches and center-fronts even; large "O" perforations indicate center-front. Close under-arm and sleeve seams as notched. Adjust stay to position underneath gathers at lower edge of waist, centers even (large "O" perforation indicates center-front), small "O" perforation at under-arm seam. Close back seam of round collar (indicated by small "o" perforation), sew to neck edge as notched. Sew standing collar to stand as notched. Close cuff seam as notched, sew to lower edge of long sleeve as notched.

For the skirt, turn hem at lower edge on double "oo" perforations. Pleat, creasing on slot perforations bring folded edge to line of small "o" perforations and press. Gather upper edge between double "TT" perforations. Lap right front gore on left, centers even (double "oo" perforations indicate center-front); stitch to position, leaving free above large "O" perforations for opening. Sew to lower edge of waist, centers even, bringing line of single small "o" perforations to under-arm seam.

Dress for small girls, carried out in cotton sponge and made without a lining. The back and long sleeves are in one piece, and the straight skirt has pleats at the sides, but gathers at the front and back.

Of attractive frocks for the small girl there is no end, and as the season progresses pretty new models appear day after day. The daintiest are, perhaps, among the new spring and summer creations. The clever model shown here is of dotted sponge trimmed with Scotch gingham in a pretty plaid. There is a long blouse, with a shoulder

APPEAL FOR GIRLS' HOME

Lieut.-Governor MacGregor and Rev. E. B. Moore Deliver Addresses in Halifax Church

(Halifax Echo)

The J. Wesley Smith Memorial church was crowded to the doors Sunday evening to hear eloquent and stirring addresses in support of the proposed Maritime Home for Delinquent Protestant Girls by His Honor the Lieutenant Governor of Nova Scotia and Rev. E. B. Moore.

In the course of his address Lieut. Governor MacGregor referred to the fact that there were many institutions philanthropic and charitable in Halifax but none for the Protestant delinquent girl. He spoke of the movement started in New Glasgow by the Women's Council through the conviction of a young girl who was sent to jail. This movement spread and thanks to the energetic efforts of Rev. G. W. F. Glendinning and Rev. Dr. J. W. McMillan much had been accomplished. A home had been purchased within the town limits of Truro, up to date subscriptions had been received to the value of \$8,185 which had come from 185 persons. His Honor made a stirring appeal for funds for this worthy project. He said that many a woman had fallen low, who if the right means had been used in her case might have been redeemed.

Rev. E. B. Moore spoke of the care of delinquent girls as one of the greatest problems of the civilized world. "What are we doing for these girls?" he asked. "We let them run

abroad in our streets with an occasional visit to the maternity home or the poor house." There was a great need of an institution where these unfortunate girls could be trained to become good honest women, ere they become so attached to their demoralizing environments that they got beyond the reach of the church.

Mr. Moore said that the Home at Truro would undoubtedly be a great blessing for the province and in conclusion asked the congregation to put forward every effort to assist those in charge of the undertaking.

At the morning service Rev. G. W. F. Glendinning spoke of the movement to a large congregation.

THREE MEN BURNED TO DEATH IN SALOON FIRE
