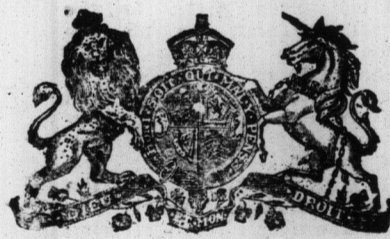

This shall be known as "Newfoundland Time," and shall be applicable to the whole colony.

Supreme Court

Before Mr. Justice Kent in Chambers

In the matter of the will of the late Richard Hennebury, Chas. Emerson, Adm., for the estate of Rd. Hennebury vs. Simon Butler, Adm. of James Hennebury and others. This hearing was adjourned from the 15th inst. P. J. Summers, B. L., appeared for the plaintiff. W. J. Higgins, B. L., for Richard Hennebury, of Mark; E. S. Piment, B. L., for Mark Hennebury and D. McEison, K.C., for Simon Butler. The counsels for the several parties were heard and the court took time to consider.

Public Notice

The attention of the Public is called to Section 32 of the Post Office Act, 1891, which provides that the P. M. General has the sole and exclusive privilege of conveying, receiving, collecting, sending and delivering of letters within and from Newfoundland. It is therefore unlawful for letters to be handed to passengers or conveyed by passengers clear of the Post Office, and any person may, and every person employed in the Post Office service shall seize any letters so unlawfully collected, sent or delivered in violation of the Act, and take them to the nearest post office and give such information to the Postmaster as he is able to give and is necessary for the effectual prosecution of the offender.

Newfoundland Patriotic Association Employment Committee

The Employment Committee has been appointed by the Newfoundland Patriotic Association "to take into consideration applications for employment in civil life from returned Soldiers and Sailors of the Newfoundland Regiment and Newfoundland Royal Naval Reserve who have been granted honourable discharges." The Committee can only perform this duty to our returned soldiers and sailors with the fullest help and co-operation of all those in the Colony who employ labour or require help or service of any kind in which these men may be employed. The Committee will prepare and keep on file a register of all men seeking employment, giving their age, qualifications and experience, so far as possible, of each applicant. This information will be available to prospective employers, and steps will be taken to bring about interview or correspondence between employers and soldier or sailor applicants. Every person or firm when requiring such help for either domestic or business purposes is therefore invited to communicate to the Committee the nature of the help required, and of the work to be done, and such other information as may be useful.

For the present the Headquarters of the Committee are at the Colonial Building, St. John's, and communications should be addressed to **A. E. PARSONS, Secretary of the Employment Committee.**

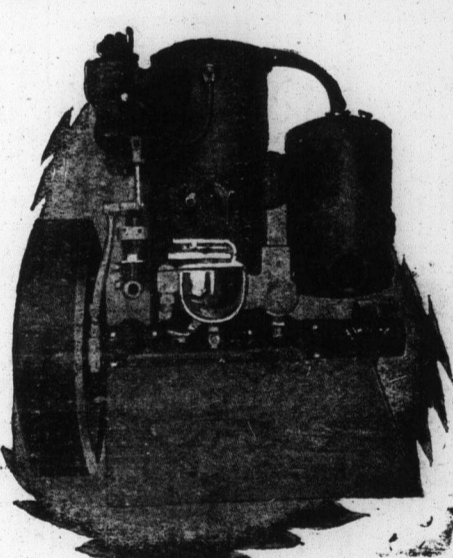
