WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 9—Qrat interstate industries can be brought under permanent federal supervision through a system of regular reports to a federal agency, in a rational, effective way, which will involve no drastic action, but on the contrary, will forestall it.

stall it.

Such is the conclusion drawn in the annual report of Herbert Knox Smith, commisioner of corporations, to the secretary of commerce and labor, which was made public today.

Coming closely upon the heels of the administration's federal incorporation bill, which has been presented to both houses of congress, Commissioner Smith's recommendations are of unusual interest.

"Publicity will improve the standing of our corporate securities both at home and abroad," Mr. Smith declared, "and will help to give to our business machinery, that foundation of fairness and openness and public confidence which it must have if it is to be a permanent factor in our national advance.

"It will bring together the government and the corporate manager in conference and co-operation, which alone can serve to adjust continuously, the complex and changing relationship between our business forces and the public welfare."
