CAPT. FOREN SUSPENDED.
Capt. Levi Foren is suspended for three months and his license is withheld for that time by the decision of the United States inspectors who gave him a hearing today on the charge of unskillfulness. He was in command of the steamer Bay State, which went ashore the night of Sept. 23 on McKenneys Point, Cape Elizabeth, and is being dismantled where she struck.

An investigation by Inspectors Harry L. Thompson and Waiter L. Blaisdell resulted in a charge of unskillfulness, now sustained and carrying suspension as the penalty. Witnesses examined included Capt Foren, his pilot, U. S. Gilpatrick, of Boston, and the bow watch, Galen F. Seavey. He was represented by counsel and the hearing lasted two hours.

Carter, of Yarmouth, Me., having been 'cst at the time, is still aftoat in southern waters, a grave menace to navigation.
