COPPER PRICES FIXED BY GOVT

Metal Will Sell at 23 1-2 a Pound for Next Months—Depression in Steel Industry.

New York, Jan. 11.—Copper prices were fixed at the government conference today with copper producers for the next four months at 23 1/2. The extent of the depression in the steel industry as a result of the inability to secure raw material is reflected in fact only one of United States Steel Corporation's furnaces in the Chicago district are in operation. Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

The sale of land of a family or say made over 18 years old, who was at the commencement of the present war, and has since continued to be a British subject, a subject of a British colony or a subject of a Dominion, is a quarter-section of available land, which may be obtained from the Department of the Interior, Ottawa, or from the Department of the Interior, St. John, N. B. Entry by proxy may be made on certain conditions. Daily session residence and cultivation of land in each of three years.

In certain districts a homesteader may secure an adjoining quarter-section as pre-emption. Pre-emption must be made within six months in each of three years after earning homesteaded land and culture to 60 acres extra. May obtain pre-emption patent as soon as homesteaded patent on certain conditions.

A settler after obtaining homesteaded patent, if he cannot secure a pre-emption may take a purchase patent in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 60 acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.

Holders of entries may claim time of employment as farm laborers in Canada during 1917, as residence duties under certain conditions.

When Dominion lands are advertised or posted for entry, returned soldiers who have served overseas and have been honorably discharged, receive one day priority in applying for land at local agent's office and receive 50% discount. Discharge papers must be presented to Agents.
