

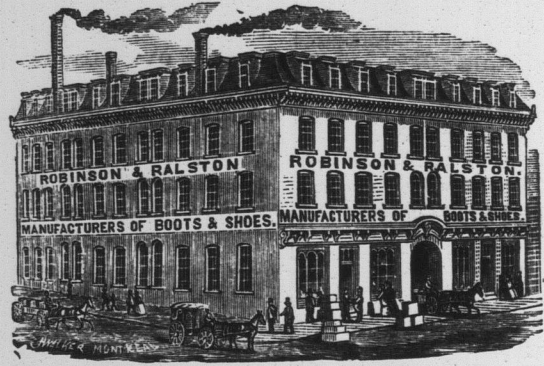

The words of this section, taken by themselves, would certainly seem to show that the Legislature intended to give a right of action against the stockholders for the amount of unpaid stock, and the words "due for" would appear to have been used for that purpose; but inasmuch as the recital of the Act shows that the object of the Legislature was only to provide a remedy for three impediments which stood in the way of any proceedings to recover the assessments, that nothing is said in the recital of any doubt as to the mode of proceeding against the stockholders, and no clear intimation is expressed, to give any different remedy than that provided by the Act of Incorporation, for the recovery to be "in the same manner" as if the calls had been regularly made. I feel bound to come to the conclusion that the Act of 32 Victoria does not give any right of action against the shareholders. I have no doubt it was assumed by the framers of the Act that there was a personal liability on the stockholders, and therefore it was unnecessary to make any provision in respect to that in the amended Act.
