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King's County Nominations—Speeches of Donville, McCreedy and Sharp.

There was a good gathering at Hampton yesterday. The contest was opened at 11 by the Sheriff, James Donville was nominated by J. B. S. Raymond and others, and J. E. B. McCreedy was nominated by the Hon. J. H. Crawford and others.

Mr. Donville was the first to speak. He proposed, he said, to meet fairly and squarely all objections to his course in Parliament. The old Government was down, and he would not kick a prostrate man. He did not desert the sinking ship because his coat has but one side.

Mr. McCreedy thought it fit and decent to say a few words to the people of the county. He said that he was not a man who would take opinions from the Minister of Marine. He would not interfere with the expansion of the territory of Ontario. Men who would oppose such a policy should be sent to Ottawa.
