PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND—1875.

A Convention of the Representatives of all the duly warranted Lodges of Prince Edward Island was held at Charlottetown, June 23, 1875, when a Grand Lodge was established according to the customary usages of the Craft.

Seven Lodges represented.

On the following day the Grand Lodge was duly organized and the Grand Officers elect duly installed, invested and proclaimed by M. W. Brother John V. Ellis, Grand Master of New Brunswick, assisted by Past Grand Master Clinch, Grand Secretary Bunting, and W. Brother G. Hudson Flewelling, all of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick.

Grand Master Ellis congratulated the Brethren upon the consummation of their efforts, which he did not doubt would redound to the advantage of Masonry.

At a subsequent Communication the Constitution and Regulations of Grand Lodge were adopted.

We most heartily welcome our neighboring sister into the communion of Grand Lodges.
