under no compulsion. at the first outbreak of the contagion, but unfortunately not in time to escape its rawages; for they carried the infection with them, and those attached by the dreaded disease on their way homeward were left by their friends on the shore to perioh unlended.

Many Indiano died in this way in addition to those whose deaths were registered but I am unable to perceive what measures it was in the power of Government to take other than those which were adopted for the protection and succoin of the white and Indian population alike.

I will only remark further on the general subject of the condition of the Indiano in the Colony that it is un. hesitatingly acknowledged to be the peculiar responsibility of Government to use every endeavour to promote the civilization, education and ultimate Christianization of the native races within out territory and that any practical scheme for advancing ! this object which it would be within the ocape of the pecuniary ability of the Colony to carry into effect would be adopted with alacrity. At present this good work is almost exclusively hands of Missionaries of various
