The Dominion authorities were not represented, though notified.

Street, J., held, that plaintiffs had failed to shew that the defendants other than the railway company had done anything to intefere with the rights claimed by plaintiffs. The railway company were alone liable, if any one was, for what had been done. Various defences were set up by the railway company, but it was necessary to consider only that which denied that the Dominion Gevernment ever became possessed of the right to grant a lease to plaintiff Perry of the ferry in question, and asserted that right as existing only in the Provincial authorities. By sec. 109 of the British North America Act, it is provided that "all lands, mines, minerals, and royalties belonging to the several Provinces . . . at the Union ore the several Provinces trusts existing in the same are situate or arise, subject to any than that of in respect thereof and to any interest other attached to the Province in the same."
