TREATY of AMITY, COMMERCE and NAVIGATION, between His Britannick Majesty and the United States of America: Signed at London, the 19th of November, 1794.

EORGE the Third, by the Grace of God, King of Great Britain, France and Ireland, Defender of the Faith, Duke of Brunfwick and Lunenburgh, Arch-Treasurer and Prince Elector of the Holy Roman Empire, &c. To all and singular to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting: Whereas Our Right Trusty and Well-beloved Counsellor, William Wyndham, Baron Grenville of Wottan, Our Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Assars, &c. &c. did, on Our Part, together with the Plenipotentiary of Our good Friends the United States of America, conclude and sign at London, on the Nineteenth Day of November, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-four, a Treaty of Amity, Commerce and Navigation between Us and Our said good Friends: And whereas a certain Additional Article has, on the Part of the said United States, been proposed to be annexed to the said Treaty as a Part thereof; to which Addition We are willing to consent; the said Treaty and Additional Article being in the Words following:

desirous, by a Treaty of Amity, Commerce and Navigation, to terminate their Differences in such a Manner as, without Reference to the Merits of their respective Complaints and Pretensions, may be the best calculated to produce mutual Satisfaction and good Understanding; and also to regulate the Commerce and Navigation between their respective Countries, Territories and People, in such a Manner as to render the same reciprocally beneficial and satisfactory; they have, respectively,
