DAVIS, ELIHU JAMES. (*North York.*) 2nd Mem.

Of U.E. Loyalist descent; great-grandfather, Ashel Davis, came from Carolina in 1790 and settled in the Co. of Halton, Ont. B. in the Tp. of York, 2 Dec. 1851. Ed. at Public Schools, Waterdown Grammar Sch. and Hamilton Commercial Coll. M., 29 Oct., 1874, Maggie, dau of David Johnston, Esq., of King Tp. Is sole mem. of the tanning firm of A. Davis & Son. Was Councillor for King Tp. 1877-8-9-80; Deputy Reeve 1881-2; Reeve 1883-4-5-6 and Warden of Co. of York 1884. First returned to Leg. Assem. 23 May, 1888, by acclamation, to fill vacancy created by resignation of the sitting mem. Dr. Widdifield. A Liberal.—*King, P.O., Ont.*

EVANTUREL, FRANCIS EUGÈNE ALFRED, LL.B. (*Prescott*).

Eldest s. of the Hon. F. Evanturel, who was Minister of Agriculture in the Macdonald-Sicotte Administration of Can. in 1862, and grands. of Francois Evanturel, who, after serving in the French army of Napoleon Bonaparte, and taking part in some of his great battles, settled in Can., and died at Quebec. B. at Quebec 31 Aug., 1849. M., 1873, Louisa, grand-daughter of the late Judge Van Felson, Quebec. Ed. at the Seminary there. Studied law at Laval University, and graduated there in 1870. Called to the bar. P.Q., 1871, and, after practising in Quebec for two years, entered the Civil Service at Ottawa. Resigned in 1881, when he settled in the Co. of Prescott, where he now practises his profession. An unsuccessful candidate for present seat at g.e. 1883. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative, but a supporter of the Mowat Administration, on account of the manner in which the then recognized organ of the Conservative party assailed the French Canadian race. Believes in religious equality.—*St. Victor d'Alfred, Ont.*
