DAOUST, JEAN BAPTISTE, J.P. [*Two Mountains*.]

S. of the late M. J. B. Daoust, by Luce St. Germain. B. at St. Eustache, Que., 18 Jan., 1819. M., Jan., 1842, Mdle. Zoé Desforbes of St. Laurent. Is Lieut. 1st Batt. Two Mountains Militia, a Commissioner for the summary trial of small causes, and has been *Préfet* of the county for several years. Has represented the Parish of St. Laurent in the parish and county municipal councils since 1845, and been Presdt. of the County Agricultural Society for eight years. Sat for present seat in Can. Assembly from 1854 until the Union. Returned to Commons at last g. e. by acclamation. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir G. Cartier.—*St. Eustache, Que.*
