

An Act to declare the mode in which the side lines of the lots in the Township of Torbolton in the County of Carleton, shall be run.

WHEREAS by the petition of the inhabitants of the Township of Torbolton in the County of Carleton, it appears that great inconvenience has resulted from the running of the side lines between the lots parallel to the side lines from the Township, as required by the 12th Vict., cap. 35; And whereas the said inhabitants have prayed that the side lines may be drawn from post to post without regard to the course of the side lines of the Township, and it is expedient under the circumstances aforesaid, to grant their prayer: Therefore Her Majesty, &c., enacts as follows;

Preamble.

- 10 I. For and notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the thirty fifth, thirty sixth, and thirty seventh sections of the Act passed in the twelfth year of Her Majesty's reign, and intituled *An Act to repeal certain Acts therein mentioned, and to make better provision respecting the admission of Land Surveyors and the survey of lands in this Province*,—all the
- 15 side lines between lots in the said Township of Torbolton shall be so drawn that the side line between any contiguous lots in any concession of the said Township, shall be a line drawn from the post at one end of the concession to the post planted at the same side of the lot bearing the same number, at the other end of the concession; and any line so
- 20 drawn shall be deemed to be, and to have been since the survey of the said Township, the true side line of the lots between which it shall be drawn; subject nevertheless to the provisions of the said Act relative to the breadth of lots and the mode of ascertaining such breadth where the original posts or monuments cannot be found, which provisions
- 25 shall in any such case apply equally to the posts or boundaries at both ends of the concession.

Side lines in Torbolton to be drawn from post to post, notwithstanding 12 V. 35.

Subject to certain provisions of the said Act when the posts cannot be found.

2. This Act shall be deemed a public Act.
