

Lady Harriers defend record

In 5 years of competition in the AUAA conference, the UNB Lady Harriers have yet to be beaten by an Atlantic University Women's Cross-country team.

The Lady Harrier's strength, depth, and determination as a team to win a 5th straight AUAA title were proven last weekend. The girls handily defeated the competition from Dalhousie and University de Moncton at a tri-meet on the AUAA Course in Centennial Park in Moncton. Unfortunately the team from Memorial was not present (Are they afraid?) and still remain the unknown factor for the AUAA championship.

The girls were nervous for this competition and were not going to take anything for granted. The team's determination was displayed from the start of the race as the UNB girls surged to the front of the pack with the sound of the starting pistol.

As the race wound through the woods, UNB runners remained in good scoring position and were showing marked improvements over previous races this season.

Margaret MacDonald lead UNB to finish first over the 3.4 miles course in 19:25. Terry Lee Daman ran an excellent

race for 2nd place in 20:24. Tammi Richardson, just missing 3rd place, turned in an equally strong effort to finish 4th in 20:54. Lynn Sutherland and Lynn Poole rounded out the team scoring for UNB with superb performances to finish 7 and 8 respectively in times of 21:34 and 21:51. Gina Spear and Wendy Woodfield who have been coming on stronger with each race turned in great efforts, finishing 13th and 20th in 22:44 and 23:20.

UNB's score of 22, shows the

required team effort to win an AUAA Cross-country title. Dalhousie's score of 44 and U de M's score of 64 were good for 2nd and 3rd places.

This weekend UNB will be in Boston to compete in one of the largest Cross-country races in North Eastern U.S.A. Between 15-20 teams are expected to compete in the Annual Codfish Invitational Cross-country Meet at the University of Mass. in Boston. This race will be an excellent experience for the UNB girls.

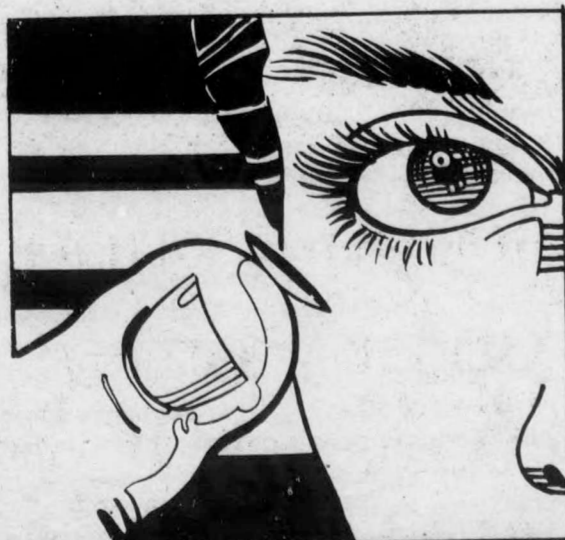

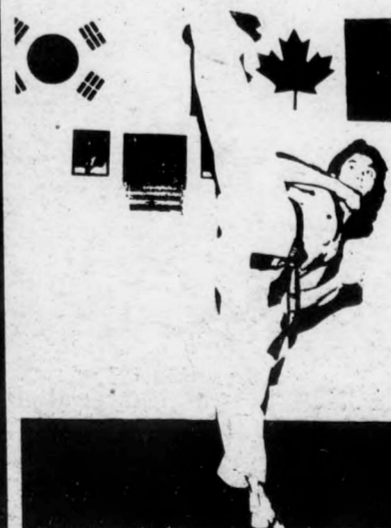
